## a. Transport and connectivity

Update from Joe Bubb:

Works to make Church Street ETRO permanent. Drainage survey results from WSP are still outstanding, however potential solutions are being looked into including an interim solution.

Alex Edwards (SC) is working directly with Keir to progress designs. Members discussed a range of interim solutions. Issue with hogs moving about in high winds and causing disruption.

Sports Direct Alley. Update has been requested regarding legal / public right of way considerations.
